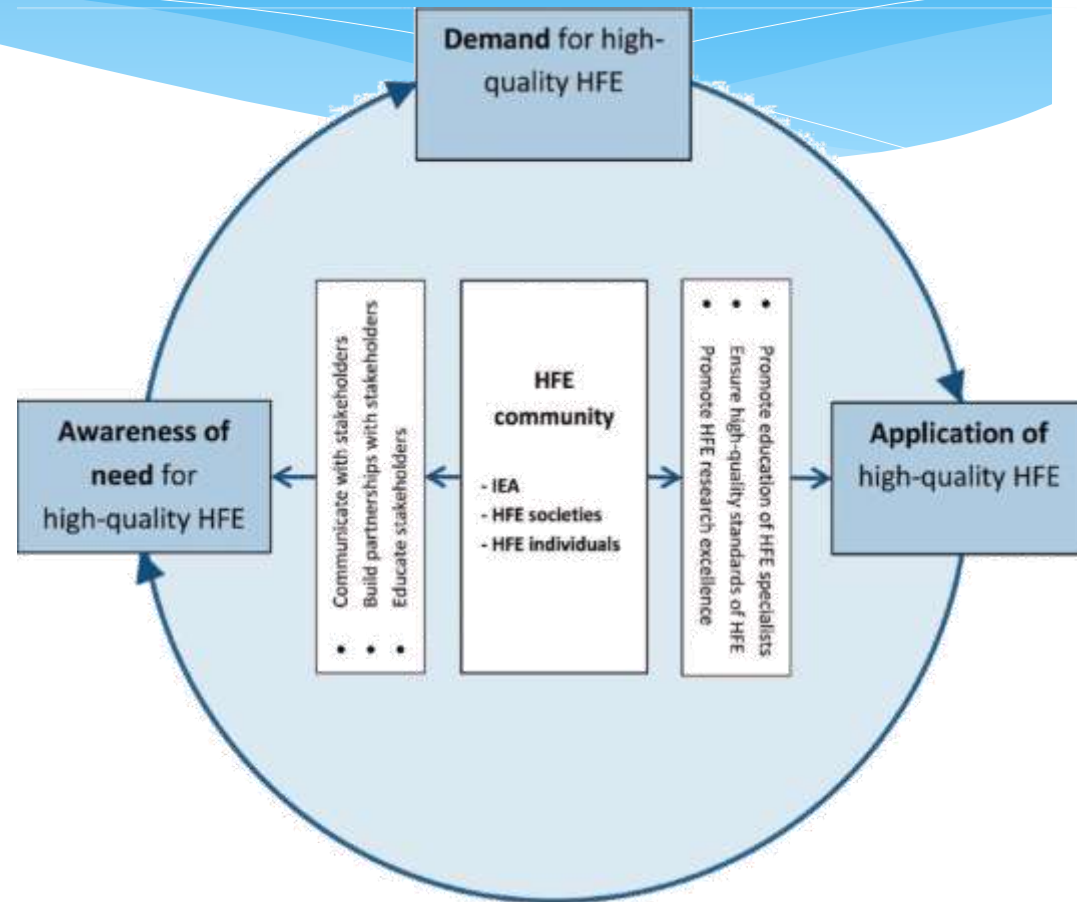

CREE Meeting, 31 th May 2013, Budapest, Hungary

The Centre for Registration of European Ergonomists CREE will be meeting at the end of May for the first time in Hungary. The Ergonomics Society of Hungary became the 14th member of CREE in 2010. Membership of CREE is open to regional ergonomics societies within the Council of Europe that are recognized by the International Ergonomics Association, and therefore also by FEES. CREE is responsible for coordinating the certification of professional ergonomists in Europe. It is one of the oldest certifying bodies for ergonomists and has been used as a model in multiple other regions of the world. This has meant that there is a good deal of standardization in the level of certification across the world. Generally ergonomists can become professionally registered if they have at least four years of academic education, which included the equivalent of at least one year of dedicated ergonomics training, and three years of professional experience. Details about registration can be found on the CREE website (www.eurerg.org). Being on the Register of CREE follows a peer-review process and ensures the quality of professional service providers for companies who are seeking high level consultants and employees. There are currently around 400 CREE registered ergonomists in Europe and it is expected that the number of registered ergonomists will soon increase, particularly from the newer member societies, covering Hungary and Poland. In conjunction with the CREE Council meeting in Budapest the Hungarian Ergonomics Society will be hosting a European Conference on Applied Ergonomics on 30th May, 2013. This gives the CREE Councilors the opportunity to meet local ergonomists and exchange experiences. On the agenda of the CREE meeting is also an exchange with the FEES President, Sylvain Leduc to discuss collaboration of activities which promote ergonomics in Europe.
